

## Share Your Story



- PROPERTY NAME:** Select an appropriate title for the historic property (eg. COURTNEY HOME). The title can be how the property is commonly known, the original and/or current owner, or other.
- YEAR BUILT:** Year home was established. If unknown, then it is appropriate to include a range.
- OWNERS/OCCUPANTS:** List key past and/or current Owners and Occupants (limited to 2).
- ADDRESS:** Provide the official street address.
- FEATURE IMAGE:** Indicate the image you feel best represents the property as the Feature Image. Please label the image *Feature Image* and write a brief description. For example, “Courtney Home south entrance (photo taken in 2019 by Robert Prebe)”
- BREIF HISTORY:** Provide a paragraph overview of the historic property.
- HOME TO:** Tell us all about the original owners of this house, perhaps something about their background, if known, and others details on key figures during its history.
- PHOTO GALLERY:** Please number each image starting with 1, 2, 3 and so on, and write a brief caption in the space provided (eg. (“View from the road where the Courtney’s hosted picnics”).
- TIMELINE IN HISTORY:** Have fun creating a timeline of events linked to the property or occurring during its history. Now we create a flow of events dating from the first dug foundation to the present time. Please label images by their corresponding year and provide as information on the event to accompany its image (limit 100 words per event). You might consider including:
  - Additions built on the house.
  - Unfortunate events or tragedies to the family or structure.
  - Each generation in the home. Did the different generation utilize the home in different ways?
  - Was the house sold at some point?
  - Famous or infamous events in the town, County, or Country as reference points.
